

# Have You Forgotten Something?

Even people who already have a Will in place, often overlook some important considerations.

**NAMING AN ALTERNATIVE PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE.** If your personal representative (executor) cannot serve when needed, the court will have to appoint a replacement. By naming an alternate in your will, you take care of this possibility. You might want to name the trust department of your bank, your attorney, or your accountant.

**NAMING A GUARDIAN FOR MINOR CHILDREN.** Some parents assume they are too young to need wills. Farthest from their thoughts is the possibility that some tragedy could disable a parent or result in a loss of one or both parents at once. Consider discussing this possibility frankly, and make decisions about who you want to be the guardian(s). Then discuss the matter and agree with the proposed guardian(s). Usually, the court will look with favor on the person(s) you name.

**NAMING FINAL BENEFICIARIES.** If your Will names only immediate members of the family, be aware that in many cases, every beneficiary named in a person's will has died. Consider naming the church to receive part of your estate for its ministries in the event your heirs predecease you.
